- Item 6 BUS 77 and UPRR Crossings Phase I
 - Manager Vela met with Texas Department of Emergency Management staff; and they informed him that this could be a phased project: Phase I would be design and Phase II would be construction. This would allow the District to start work on design. TDEM has given the District a one year window to provide the Phase I (design) deliverables. Manager Vela instructed Eric Scheibe to begin the design work.

Item 7 Projects

- 7.1 Combes Relief Project Motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio and passed to pay the Harlingen Irrigation District up to \$160,000 to construct the 50' open drain.
- 7.2 Murphy Diversion Channel Manager Vela and Engineer Brown met with Daniel Castro to discuss the possible purchase of right of way from him to construct an open drain as part of this diversion channel. He expressed interest in selling the property to the District. He will be securing a realtor to assist him on the price of his acreage.
- 7.3 Nixon/FM 508 Crossing Redesign fees came in at \$42,000. No action was taken to pay the fees. Engineer Brown will talk to the engineer to try to reduce the cost of these redesign fees.

Item 8 License Agreements/Rights of Way/Permits/Interlocal Cooperation Contracts

8.1 Palm Valley Drainage Project – Lowest bid came in at 2.9 million dollars, more than double what was budgeted for this project. After discussion, motion was to assist the City of Palm Valley with this drainage project in the amount of \$200,000.
